



We are so excited to offer you this jackpot event and we appreciate your support and participation. For years we have put on NRCHA sanctioned shows and had experience in NRHA shows. We want to go back to the basics and offer a place for all experiences and levels and a reasonable rate. It is our goal to provide all competitors and prospective competitors a positive environment among friends. Both professional riders and non professional riders can learn from each other. We want to create a place for riders to have fun and work together.

Following are our rules and definitions that will be helpful to you as you participate our shows. More specific rules, patterns and judges cards can be found in the NRCHA and NRHA rule book.

1. All riders and owners showing must be in good standing with High Desert, the NRCHA and NRHA. (you do not have to be a member of NRCHA or NRHA)
2. High Desert will follow the NRCHA and NRHA rules and regulations and rules of conduct and behavior.
3. Three calls will be made to call contestants for a class, then they will be considered a scratch. No refund for a scratch.
4. Year end points will be figured on a point system. Each entry will earn 1 point for each horse placing under them. (up to a maximum of 20 points per class). 5 of the 6 shows will be counted. You may drop your lowest score and/or a no show.
5. Return checks will be charged a \$20 fee. NSF checks are to be paid with cash or money order within 30 days of notification. Non payment will suspend eligibility for future shows. All points will be suspended until fees are paid.
6. **100% Jackpot money will be paid back same day.** Checks will be made to riders unless we are notified otherwise.
7. Both rider and owner must be a current member of High Desert. Please keep your card in case there is any discrepancies in your membership.
8. A waiver will be provided at the arena. All contestants must sign a waiver before you ride.
9. Cow Horse entries need to be in the Tuesday before show so we can have a cow count. Reiners may enter up until Saturday. Same day entries will be taken, however a early entry would be great.
10. Cow Horse Entries will be drawn Friday night. Late entries will be drawn per NRCHA and NRHA rules.

Cow Horse Classes

(Herd work will start at 9am)

Open Riders – Open to all riders. Classes will consist of herd work and rein work.

3500 Riders – Open to any rider that has not won more than \$3500 in a reined cow horse event in the last 3 years. Classes will consist of herd work and rein work.

Rookie 700 – Open to Non-Pro riders including youth. Riders may not have won more than \$700.00 in a cow horse event in the last 3 years. No ownership restrictions apply. Rider can show one or two handed in any legal bit as defined by the NRCHA. Class will consist of rein work and then they will call for a cow to box. No herd work.

Youth 16 and under – This class is open to youth riders 16 and under on January 1st of the current year. If our interest is high in this class it will be split with riders in their respective age divisions. Rider to show one or two handed in any legal bit as defined by the NRCHA. No restrictions on ownership. Youth are not allowed to show stallions in the youth class. Class will consist of rein work and then they will call for a cow to box. No herd work.

Snaffle Bit Classes - Open to 3 year old horses as of January 1st of the current show year. The rider must use both hands on the reins, except in the herd work. Entries must be shown in a standard headstall using a smooth snaffle bit per NRCHA.

Hackamore Classes – Open to horses 5 years of age and under as of January 1st of the current show year that have never been shown in a bridle or two-rein down at any judged class or event with the exception of horse sales. The rider shall use closed reins. Two hands must be used on the reins, except in the herd work.

Two-Rein Classes – open to horses of any age that have not shown in the bridle down the fence in any judged classes or event with the exception of horse sales prior to November 16 of the current show year. These horses can be shown only one year in this class. The rider must use one hand on the reins.

Bridle Classes – Open to horses of any age, to be ridden in approved bit.

Cow Horse Jackpot will start at 9am. We will do the herd work, then the Rookie and Youth will do their dry work and box, then we will do the rest of they dry work.

Reining Classes

(to start after the Cow Horse Jackpot 2 pm)

Open – Open to any rider

Non Pro – Open to any rider that does not take monies for training horses.

Rookie 700 - Open to Non-Pro riders including youth. Riders may not have won more than \$700.00 in a reining event. No ownership restrictions apply.

Youth 16 and under – This class is open to youth riders 16 and under on January 1st of the current year. If our interest is high in this class it will be split with riders in their respective age divisions. No restrictions on ownership. Youth are not allowed to show stallions in the youth class.
